Tena koutou Parents and Whanau

Welcome to week eight of term one.

I am sure that you are all aware, by this stage, of the decision by our government to impose very stringent requirements for travel to New Zealand as well as on large gatherings to try and reduce the risk of the spread of Corona Virus. As a school we are very aware of the potential risk of the transfer of this virus from person to person.

At this stage this has not happened in New Zealand but we are being very vigilant in this regard. Below is further information in this regard.

COVID - 19 (Corona Virus) Update

- We ask that you do not send a sick child to school. If we discover that any child is sick and showing flu like symptoms you will be asked to pick him/her up immediately.
- We also ask that <u>parents or caregivers</u> do not come into school if you have flu like symptoms or have a cold. You are welcome to phone or email the school or your child's teacher in such cases.
 - This is to protect our children and staff members from any risk.
- Please sign up to your child's See Saw account as a matter of urgency if you have not already done so.
- See Saw, our school's digital platform, will be used to ensure that we can communicate with families and endeavour to keep your child's education going in the event of schools in New Zealand being closed in the future if the Corona Virus continues to gain momentum in New Zealand.

Please remind your child of the following:

- regularly washing hands (for at least 20 seconds with warm water and soap and dry thoroughly)
- covering your mouth and nose when you sneeze
- staying home if you are sick
- avoiding close contact with anyone with cold or flu-like symptoms
- if you feel unwell you should avoid public gatherings and events.

At present, it is business as usual for our school but I will keep you up to date of any new developments or advisories from the Ministry of Education or the Ministry of Health.

A busy time in Rm 10 this week. We are excited about our workshops to support our learning about Culture; These are being done across Te Moananui A Kiwa (Hub 3) in mixed class groups.
